

Ronnie Fox is inspired to help Haifa University

► A VISIT to Haifa University while on holiday in Israel last summer proved an inspiration to London lawyer Ronnie Fox. So impressed was he with the diverse student intake that he has decided

to give the university free legal advice.

Mr Fox, 61, has been made an honorary counsel to the British Friends of the University.
